FATHER GREGORY'S LETTER TO ALL PARENTS OF CHILDREN WHO WILL BE MAKING THEIR FIRST HOLY COMMUNION AT ST EDWARD'S IN 2025.



As your Parish Priest, I want to thank you for promoting the beginning of your treasured child's personal journey towards Jesus. Receiving their First Holy Communion is a wonderful and important step in the development of their Faith.

I am aware that some of you come to church every Sunday because, like me, you were raised that way by your parents and grandparents, and you cannot imagine Sunday without meeting God in the Eucharist. **'A Sunday without God is a wasted Sunday'** - that's what my parents and grandparents used to say. I am convinced that, like me, you are very grateful to them for bringing you up in the spirit of the Catholic Faith, for the witness of their own faith, and for the encouragement they have given you. Now you feel that it is your duty and privilege to pass on the Catholic faith to your children.

There are also those among you who come to Mass very rarely or only occasionally at Christmas or Easter. Some of you have gotten used to this, but some of you are not comfortable with that situation and need some encouragement and inspiration.

But there are also parents who for various reasons do not practise at all, and perhaps their child's Communion will give them a wonderful opportunity to change that. I am going to be very honest with you and remind you that your child's First Holy Communion can only make sense if he or she - with your help and support - builds a true, strong and deep relationship with Jesus through participation in Sunday Masses. It is very important to learn about Jesus in school, it is also very important to learn all the basic prayers like Our Father and Hail Mary and the catechism, but the most important, absolutely irreplaceable and crucial thing is to attend Sunday Eucharist as a family and pray at home as a family. Sometimes people say to me that they don't need to go to church, they can pray anywhere, among nature, in a park, in the woods, on the beach, up a hill. My reply is always the same: Could you imagine a couple in love who do not spend any time together, and don't need to meet? People in love who say: 'I will text you next week'? That kind of relationship is not possible and would be very hard to maintain. This is the same with our relationship with God. We need to work on this relationship and part of this includes our presence at Mass. Although we can admire the work of God's creation in many places, the only place that we can be at the closest contact with God is during Mass and when we receive Holy Communion.

I realize that for some of you, work may make it difficult to attend Mass every Sunday, and various unpredictable things, including health issues and holidays, may prevent you from attending Mass every Sunday, but your every effort to do so will be incredibly encouraging to your children and precious in the eyes of God. Every effort of yours in this regard, even the smallest, will be rewarded. For some of you it may be hard start or restart, but once you try and get into the habit, you will find that you will benefit in ways that you could never have imagined. You will become a part of a family who journeys together on its way to heaven. As a priest supported by many wonderful volunteers: readers, Eucharistic ministers, cleaners, altar servers, organists, musicians, welcomers, flower group and so on, we do our best to make our Sunday Masses beautiful and uplifting. If you wish, you are very welcome to become involved.

Moreover, I would like to ask you to teach your child and say with him/her daily these three simple prayers: **Our Father, Hail Mary,** and one more prayer which I remember from my childhood:

**O Angel of God**, my guardian dear to whom God's love commits me here, ever this day (night) be at my side to light and guard, to rule and guide. Amen.
