




THE BIG LENT WALK


A GENTLE REQUEST FROM OUR NEIGHBOURS





PASTORAL LETTER



PASTORAL LETTER CONCERNING THE TERMINALLY ILL (END OF LIFE) BILL

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The Terminally III (End of Life) Bill, as it is for formally known, received a second reading at the end of November. This is currently with the committee which will scrutinise it before the legislation is returned for further voting in the House of Commons. Our country is divided about this legislation. Some have campaigned for this over a long period of time. Nevertheless, there is a broad coalition of voices, from various religious traditions and none, who are very concerned about the implications of the idea that individuals may be able to commit suicide with the assistance of medical professionals. The research briefing from the House of Commons Library puts things this way: 'The broad aim of the Terminally III Adults (End of Life) Bill is to allow adults aged 18 and over, who have mental capacity, are terminally ill and are in the final six months of their life, to request assistance from a doctor to end their life.' It will be challenging to overturn this proposed legislation, but not impossible. Within our diocese, 13 MPs voted for this Bill and 10 voted against it.

From what we hear, some politicians have serious concerns about the proposed safeguards around the legislation. Will there really be rigorous oversight to prevent misuse of the right to end one's life? It is clear that these safeguards are unravelling. How may anyone know with certainty that someone is in the final six months of mortal life? We pray the expert evidence being presently considered will also focus upon the wonderful palliative care that takes place in hospices and other places. Palliative care professionals have already expressed concern about the funding and research in this important area of medicine. Will this proposed new legislation damage the provision of palliative care even further? The Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales have already submitted evidence to the Bill Committee emphasising that this legislation is unworkable.

This proposed law is a bad tree that cannot bear good fruit. Christ's disciples have much to encourage them to pray and work for the promotion of a culture of life. The mystery of eternal life we profess is presented so well by St Paul in today's liturgy: 'Death is swallowed up in victory.' The truths of the Gospel proclaimed by our Lord have long been challenged and disparaged within a society that is largely indifferent to the fundamental kerygmatic mysteries of our faith - we are created in God's image and likeness; despite humanity's fall from grace, God sent his beloved Son amongst us. Jesus lovingly offered his life in loving obedience to his Father and for our sake. He rose again in his human body and ascended to the Father, fulfilling his promise to send the Holy Spirit to us. As the Body of Christ, the Church seeks to build the Kingdom our Saviour inaugurated in his life, death and resurrection.

And so, I invite you to join me with two actions. The first is to pray. We pray for those who are seriously ill and dying. May they discover the hope of eternal life we share in Christ. And may they receive good palliative care in their suffering. We pray for those in the medical profession who will feel very challenged by this proposed legislation. We pray for our political representatives that their consciences will encourage them to stand against this bad legislation. And please write to your MP. Your letter does not need to be long or complicated. Just reach out to them and encourage them to vote against assisted dying.

We may ask ourselves, what's the point? No one will take notice of my prayers or actions. Against these understandable feelings, I am very encouraged by the words of the apostle Paul at the end of today's second reading: 'Therefore, my brothers and sisters, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labour is not in vain.'

Pilgrim Cross



What is Pilgrim Cross?

It is a pilgrimage which takes place in Holy Week inclusive of all ages. Eleven groups ('Legs') set off from different parts of England, walking around 120 miles over seven days, carrying a wooden cross. The pilgrims are provided with food and shelter by generous people along the way, and all the groups meet to celebrate Easter together in the ancient Marian shrine of Walsingham. Kettering Leg is mainly made up of students and young adults.

What happens during the week?

Much of the day is spent walking – which provides an opportunity to talk and get to know the rest of the group, as well as spending time in reflection, and enjoying the varied scenery we pass through. There is much music and laughter along the way.

We share our journey with people we encounter along the way, especially parishioners who provide a welcome, hospitality, and share in times of prayer.

Who walks?

Pilgrims come from all over the UK and from around the world. Kettering Leg is mainly made up of students and recent graduates, but many keep coming back long after university. Our chaplain is a Catholic priest but the whole group is involved in our liturgy during the week.



Is it expensive?

Not at all. Everything you will need will be cheap or easy to borrow. The week itself costs just £60 for students or unwaged pilgrims, and £200 for those who are waged (£110 for low-waged). If that's too much, don't worry – financial support is available.

Why walk?

People take part for many reasons, and no two people get exactly the same thing from it. It is a great way to celebrate what is the most important week in the Church's year, and it's a great way to experience community and to make new friends. New walkers are always made very welcome and given lots of support. If 120 miles sound like a long way, it's easier than you think and you don't need to be particularly fit to take part.

40 HOURS DEVOTION AT ST EDWARD'S 21st/22nd JUNE 2025



On the Friday and Saturday before Corpus Christi Sunday, our parish will be holding a 40 Hours Devotion as a part of the Jubilee Year Celebrations. We still have a lot of time to prepare our parish for this event, but I wanted to give you a glimpse of what is planned for the weekend of 21st/22nd June.

What I would like you to do in the coming weeks is to look at the schedule at the end of the online newsletter and to let me know if you and your community can accept my invitation to support our prayer initiative. Any ideas for your particular time slot would be welcome. For instance, you could lead: the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, the Stations of the Cross, you can play and sing Eucharistic hymns, read and meditate on the Scriptures. You should also make time for silent prayer. The most important thing is to adore God present among us in the mystery of the Eucharist, and that is why the Blessed Sacrament is never left alone during those forty hours.

What is the 40 Hours Devotion? The Forty Hours devotion is a special form of solemn exposition of the Most Holy Sacrament for about forty hours, during which continuous prayer is offered in adoration before the Eucharistic Jesus.

Why forty hours? According to St Augustine of Hippo, forty hours was the time Jesus spent in the Holy Sepulchre from burial on Good Friday to his resurrection on Easter day.

Symbolism of the number 40 in the Bible: The number 40 in the Bible represents a period of purification and atonement (reparation), of tribulation and spiritual trial, of penance and fasting, with the purpose of leading the faithful to repentance of one's sins and so to a renewed conversion to God:

- the Great Flood lasted forty days and forty nights (Genesis 7:12)
- Moses spent forty days on Mount Sinai waiting to receive the Law (Exodus 24:18);
- the journey in the desert of the prophet Elijah (1 Kings 19:8)
- the period of penance in the city of Nineveh lasted forty days (Jonah 3);
- the journey in the desert of the Jews lasted forty years;
- the period of fasting of Our Lord Jesus, after the Baptism, lasted forty days and nights (Matthew 4:2);
- the appearance of Christ to his disciples occurred for forty days after the resurrection (Acts 1:3).

A bit of history: There is uncertainty on how the devotion originated, possibly around the XII century in Dalmatia. However, the Forty Hours' devotion as it is known today begun in Italy during the XVI century as a penitential period in preparation for the Paschal Triduum. In those times when there was great turmoil, instability and war in Europe, priests started exposing the Blessed Sacrament during the forty hours, beseeching the Lord especially for peace in the world. It was also used to draw people away from profane customs and, in fact, it spread as reparation to atone for the sins committed during "Carnevale" (carnival), but also as a remedy for the Reformation. Some of the people who started, developed and promoted the devotion were diocesan priests, others belonged to orders like the Barnabites, the Capuchins and the Jesuits. The Forty Hours' devotion is the origin of Perpetual Adoration.

Saints associated with the development of the Forty Hours: Saint Anthony Zaccaria, Saint Charles Borromeo, Saint Philip Neri, Saint Ignatius Loyola, Saint Alphonsus Liguori.

Diocesan Pilgrimage to Walsingham



This year our diocesan pilgrimage to Walsingham takes place on Saturday 14 June. The pilgrimage will begin with Mass at the Basilica in the Catholic Shrine at midday followed by lunch and at 3pm pilgrims process from the Shrine, on the holy mile to the Abbey Grounds for the final service. Parish groups are welcome to attend and encouraged to bring parish banners with them for the procession. All are welcome.

National Jubilee Pilgrimage Walk

The Pilgrimage of Hope is a national walking pilgrimage culminating at St Barnabas' Cathedral, Nottingham, on 13th-14th September 2025, with a Solemn Mass for the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Inspired by the values of the Sisters of the Holy Cross, it promotes compassion, faith, prayer, and community.

Four main routes begin at the Catholic cathedrals in Cardiff, Leeds, Norwich, and London, following established hiking trails and incorporating blessings with the Sign of the Cross and the Gospels. 'Perpetual pilgrims' will walk the full distance, while others can join for sections, including accessible routes for wheelchairs and buggies. Non-walkers can contribute through support, hospitality, and prayer, with additional feeder routes allowing participation from every diocese.

This pilgrimage coincides with the 2025 Jubilee, marking 1700 years since the First Ecumenical Council of Nicaea and 175 years since the restoration of the Catholic hierarchy in England & Wales.

A plenary indulgence is a grace granted by the Church which cleanses our soul and helps us to grow closer to God. When we sin, we not only damage our relationship with God, we create a need for healing and repair in our souls and in the world. Through Reconciliation God forgives our sins, but the effects of our sins may still need to be addressed. Indulgences are a beautiful practice combining prayer, good works and spiritual renewal, to help repair that damage. Indulgences can also be applied to souls in purgatory.

What must I do?

Be detached from all sin

Make a Sacramental Confession Receive Holy Communion

Pray for the Pope's Intentions

Notes: Normally, only one plenary indulgence can be obtained per day, However, the faithful who have carried out an act of charity on behalf of the souls in purgatory, if they receive holy Communion a second time that day, can obtain the plenary indulgence twice on the same day (applicable only to the deceased.)

A single sacramental confession is sufficient for several plenary indulgences, but frequent sacramental confession is encouraged in order to obtain the grace of deeper conversion and purity of heart. For each plenary indulgence that is sought, however, a separate holy Communion and a separate prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father are required.

The following churches have been designated Jubilee Churches by Bishop David Oakley within the Diocese of Northampton. A central focus of the Jubilee Year is the forgiveness of sins, especially through the granting of indulgences. As pilgrims of hope we are encouraged to make a pilgirmage to one of these churches, or another designated church outside our diocese, to obtain the graces of an indulgence. Pastoral areas, parishes and individuals are welcome to journey to any of these jubilee sites.


