

Reflections from the Open Meeting (pre-visitation meeting) at St. Brendan's School Corby with Bishop David 18th March 2025



About 100 people attended the open session from across St. Lukes Pastoral area, which covers Corby, Kettering, Rushden, Wellingborough and many villages and small towns. Our parish was very well represented. Thank you to those who attended.

This is what we found out. There were once 13 priests covering this pastoral area, but now there are only 8. This is an important and crucial point within the Catholic Church as it fundamentally needs to shift, so that parishioners take a more active role in church life, delivering its activities, and supporting the Priests, because in its current form the work load is unsustainable for the 8 Priests. Towards the end of the meeting the Bishop announced a big change for Corby. One of the parish priests will be moved elsewhere, and there will be only one parish priest for the whole town. He might be supported by an assistant priest. This year there will be three priests of major parishes retiring in the diocese. Unfortunately, there will be no priestly ordinations this year. The bishop also mentioned that he is only allowed to invite three new priests from overseas in a given year due to visa restrictions. Our dean, Father Mark Floody reminded us though, that all these statistics should not be seen as something negative, indicating that the church is in decline. Rather, it is a call for all us Catholics to enter an exciting process of waking up and exploring new ways of promoting our catholic faith and reaching out to others, and becoming missionary disciples.

The meeting was the start of this process where we were invited to join the conversation to reflect on our parish's community life and mission into the future. It includes priestly provision, property and finance, together with all that we need to be outward-looking, flourishing and resilient Catholic communities.

On Tuesday we were asked to present three strengths and three challenges from St. Edwards Parish which includes Desborough, Rothwell, Burton Latimer and Kettering. One of our strengths in the past year within our Parish has been the many new pastoral initiatives to promote community involvement and faith enrichment such as: Mission Kettering (2024), hospital ministry (re-established after the pandemic) the youth group (re-established in 2024) bereavement masses (2024) themed masses or musical events on particular feast or Saints days e.g. St. Cecilia's feast day (2024), Mass for Marriages in Marriage Week (2025), St Valentine's Day (2025), Stations of the Cross led by different communities (2025).

Over the coming months we will be planning and preparing to facilitate listening groups which we want you to be part of, yes, this means you. Your voices and experiences are essential to this process and we want you to join the conversation.

Therefore, we are looking to gather a team of listeners, specifically to help deliver these groups. If you have good listening skills, (perhaps bilingual), are open to embracing the conversations that lie ahead, and are able and willing to help, please contact Father Gregory.

There is training for listeners, which it is not mandatory, but might be useful. It will be online next Thursday, 27th March from 7.30 pm - 9 pm. Please use the link below.




PILGRIM CROSS 2025



40 HOURS DEVOTION AT ST EDWARD'S 21st/22nd JUNE 2025



On the Friday and Saturday before Corpus Christi Sunday, our parish will be holding a 40 Hours Devotion as a part of the Jubilee Year Celebrations. We still have a lot of time to prepare our parish for this event, but I wanted to give you a glimpse of what is planned for the weekend of 21st/22nd June.

What I would like you to do in the coming weeks is to look at the schedule at the end of the online newsletter and to let me know if you and your community can accept my invitation to support our prayer initiative. Any ideas for your particular time slot would be welcome. For instance, you could lead: the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, the Stations of the Cross, you can play and sing Eucharistic hymns, read and meditate on the Scriptures. You should also make time for silent prayer. The most important thing is to adore God present among us in the mystery of the Eucharist, and that is why the Blessed Sacrament is never left alone during those forty hours.

What is the 40 Hours Devotion? The Forty Hours devotion is a special form of solemn exposition of the Most Holy Sacrament for about forty hours, during which continuous prayer is offered in adoration before the Eucharistic Jesus.

Why forty hours? According to St Augustine of Hippo, forty hours was the time Jesus spent in the Holy Sepulchre from burial on Good Friday to his resurrection on Easter day.

Symbolism of the number 40 in the Bible: The number 40 in the Bible represents a period of purification and atonement (reparation), of tribulation and spiritual trial, of penance and fasting, with the purpose of leading the faithful to repentance of one's sins and so to a renewed conversion to God:

- the Great Flood lasted forty days and forty nights (Genesis 7:12)
- Moses spent forty days on Mount Sinai waiting to receive the Law (Exodus 24:18);
- the journey in the desert of the prophet Elijah (1 Kings 19:8)
- the period of penance in the city of Nineveh lasted forty days (Jonah 3);
- the journey in the desert of the Jews lasted forty years;
- the period of fasting of Our Lord Jesus, after the Baptism, lasted forty days and nights (Matthew 4:2);
- the appearance of Christ to his disciples occurred for forty days after the resurrection (Acts 1:3).

A bit of history: There is uncertainty on how the devotion originated, possibly around the XII century in Dalmatia. However, the Forty Hours' devotion as it is known today begun in Italy during the XVI century as a penitential period in preparation for the Paschal Triduum. In those times when there was great turmoil, instability and war in Europe, priests started exposing the Blessed Sacrament during the forty hours, beseeching the Lord especially for peace in the world. It was also used to draw people away from profane customs and, in fact, it spread as reparation to atone for the sins committed during "Carnevale" (carnival), but also as a remedy for the Reformation. Some of the people who started, developed and promoted the devotion were diocesan priests, others belonged to orders like the Barnabites, the Capuchins and the Jesuits. The Forty Hours' devotion is the origin of Perpetual Adoration.

Saints associated with the development of the Forty Hours: Saint Anthony Zaccaria, Saint Charles Borromeo, Saint Philip Neri, Saint Ignatius Loyola, Saint Alphonsus Liguori.

Diocesan Pilgrimage to Walsingham



This year our diocesan pilgrimage to Walsingham takes place on Saturday 14 June. The pilgrimage will begin with Mass at the Basilica in the Catholic Shrine at midday followed by lunch and at 3pm pilgrims process from the Shrine, on the holy mile to the Abbey Grounds for the final service. Parish groups are welcome to attend and encouraged to bring parish banners with them for the procession. All are welcome.

National Jubilee Pilgrimage Walk

The Pilgrimage of Hope is a national walking pilgrimage culminating at St Barnabas' Cathedral, Nottingham, on 13th-14th September 2025, with a Solemn Mass for the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Inspired by the values of the Sisters of the Holy Cross, it promotes compassion, faith, prayer, and community.

Four main routes begin at the Catholic cathedrals in Cardiff, Leeds, Norwich, and London, following established hiking trails and incorporating blessings with the Sign of the Cross and the Gospels. 'Perpetual pilgrims' will walk the full distance, while others can join for sections, including accessible routes for wheelchairs and buggies. Non-walkers can contribute through support, hospitality, and prayer, with additional feeder routes allowing participation from every diocese.

This pilgrimage coincides with the 2025 Jubilee, marking 1700 years since the First Ecumenical Council of Nicaea and 175 years since the restoration of the Catholic hierarchy in England & Wales.

Suggested Methods of Regular Giving:

Regular Standing Order via your Bank - this is the preferred way which saves paper and therefore is kinder to the environment. We receive advices of Parishioners payments from the Diocese and we are then able to make sure your donation reaches our Parish.

Giving through Weekly Dated Envelopes which are issued in boxes for use throughout the year.

Donations by Card is a new way of giving, and you will find the Dona Station next to the statue of the Sacred Heart.

Gift Aid, please may we encourage you to consider Gift Aiding your regular donations, providing that you are a UK Tax payer, this means that your giving is increased for the benefit of the Parish. You may indicate your interest on the giving enquiry form.

You can also support the Parish by **making a donation through the letterbox** of the Presbytery.

New Wineskins for the St. Luke's Pastoral Area

"And no one puts new wine into old wineskins. If he does, the wine will burst the skins...but new wine is for fresh wineskins."

Mark 2:22

The St Luke's Pastoral Area includes Corby, Kettering, Rushden, Wellingborough and around a hundred villages and small towns. The area is changing rapidly with huge amounts of new building, but our Catholic structures date from the 1880s and 1960s. Bishop David reminds us that 'new wine needs new wineskins', and is asking everyone to reflect on our community life and mission into the future, including our priestly provision, finances and property. The area is growing and revitalising but the North Northants Strategic Plan identifies areas of significant poverty and 'left behind' neighbourhoods.

Combining Bishop David's hopes for our area with the North Northants plan challenges us:

- 1. To support the local Catholic community to thrive through good stewardship of people, property and finances.
- 2. Empowering everyone to deepen their faith, with a focus on children, young people and families.
- 3. Becoming more active, welcoming and inclusive communities, open to the new housing estates and the needs of local people.
- 4. And planning for a sustainable future by caring for our common home.

Underlying this vision are active and empowered communities, driven by local decision-making, shared identity, and collective discernment of the Holy Spirit.

Your voice and experience are essential to this process.



Jubilee Year Indulgence



A plenary indulgence is a grace granted by the Church which cleanses our soul and helps us to grow closer to God. When we sin, we not only damage our relationship with God, we create a need for healing and repair in our souls and in the world. Through Reconciliation God forgives our sins, but the effects of our sins may still need to be addressed. Indulgences are a beautiful practice combining prayer, good works and spiritual renewal, to help repair that damage. Indulgences can also be applied to souls in purgatory.

WHAT IF I CAN'T DO THOSE THINGS DUE TO SICKNESS OR OTHER SERIOUS REASON?

United in spirit with the faithful taking part in person, one may recite the Our Father, Apostles Creed and Jubilee Prayer, offering their sufferings or hardships of their lives.

What must I do?

Be detached from all sin

Make a Sacramental Confession Receive Holy Communion

Pray for the Pope's Intentions

Notes: Normally, only one plenary indulgence can be obtained per day, However, the faithful who have carried out an act of charity on behalf of the souls in purgatory, if they receive holy Communion a second time that day, can obtain the plenary indulgence twice on the same day (applicable only to the deceased.)

A single sacramental confession is sufficient for several plenary indulgences, but frequent sacramental confession is encouraged in order to obtain the grace of deeper conversion and purity of heart. For each plenary indulgence that is sought, however, a separate holy Communion and a separate prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father are required.



Our Jubilee Churches



The following churches have been designated Jubilee Churches by Bishop David Oakley within the Diocese of Northampton. A central focus of the Jubilee Year is the forgiveness of sins, especially through the granting of indulgences. As pilgrims of hope we are encouraged to make a pilgirmage to one of these churches, or another designated church outside our diocese, to obtain the graces of an indulgence. Pastoral areas, parishes and individuals are welcome to journey to any of these jubilee sites.


