THE CANONISATION OF CARLO ACUTIS AND PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI



On **7 September 2025**, the Church will celebrate a moment of great joy as Carlo Acutis and Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati are canonised by Pope Leo XIV in St Peter's Square. Carlo, often called the "cyber-apostle of the Eucharist," was a teenager from Milan who used his love of technology to spread devotion to Christ present in the Blessed Sacrament. His deep Eucharistic faith and ordinary yet holy way of living have inspired countless young people around the world. Pier Giorgio Frassati, who died in 1925 at the age of 24 after contracting polio, is remembered for his zest for life, generosity to the poor, and devotion to prayer. Nicknamed "the man of the Beatitudes" by St John Paul II, he is a model of faith-filled action in the world. This canonisation, originally scheduled for April 27, was postponed following the death of Pope Francis on April 21. In announcing the new date, Pope Leo XIV highlighted how these two young Italians, one from the early 20th century, the other from our own time, demonstrate that holiness is possible in every age and circumstance.

As we approach 7 September, our Diocese unites with the universal Church in prayer and thanksgiving. Carlo and Pier Giorgio, two luminous witnesses of youthful holiness, remind us that sanctity is not reserved for a few but is a call for all the baptised. May their example encourage our young people to live their faith with courage, joy, and love for Christ.

DID YOU KNOW?

Blessed Carlo Acutis (1991-2006) Born in London, grew up in Milan / Loved computers and gaming, but above all the Eucharist / Created an online exhibition of Eucharistic miracles / Died of leukemia at age 15 / Called the "cyber-apostle of the Eucharist"

Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati (1901–1925) Born in Turin, Italy / Student, mountain climber, and lover of the outdoors / Tirelessly served the poor and sick of his city / Member of Catholic Action and the Dominican lay order / Died of polio at age 24, known as "the man of the Beatitudes"

Many of them we meet at Masses at St Edward's, but there are also those who although Catholics, don't have much contact with our parish. We would like to reach out to them. I would also like to organise regular Masses followed by gatherings in the Parish Hall so that both children and adults affected by any kind disability, and also their parents, siblings and friends can get to know each other, support each other, and share their experiences, joys, and struggles. Our first Mass will be held on

Once I initiate this group and manage to find leaders, I will take a back seat and my role will be limited to being the spiritual director of the group. At this point I would like to invite:

- Catechists who would like to discuss the possibility of an individualised programme of sacramental preparation.
- Volunteers who are willing to help with Mass, refreshments in the Parish Hall, welcomers, school staff, and anyone who would like to contribute in any way to the meetings.

WE ARE PLANNING TO PAINT AND RENOVATE OUR PARISH HALL



Our Parish Hall when it was a church, before 1946.

This week, we are planning to paint our Parish Hall and renovate the floor. Please be aware that the Hall will be reopened when all the work is completed, that is at the end of September.

We are very blessed as a parish to have such a space for various meetings and pastoral activities. The Hall is regularly used by our catechists and children for sacramental preparation. The UCM ladies hold their meetings in the meeting room. On every first Wednesday of the month, we have our coffee mornings. On every first Friday of the month, we invite the youth from our parish for their monthly activities with prayers, games and pizzas. Our Soup Kitchen teams cook and feed about 40 people who are in need and struggle financially. The Hall is used by the Brownies. It is also used by the Syro-Malabar community for catechism classes and Alcoholics Anonymous on Sundays.

It is worth knowing that before St Edward's church was built and consecrated on 24th September 1946 (next year we will be celebrating the **80**th anniversary of this event), our Hall was used as a church.

Before any work can be done, we need to clear the main hall completely. Therefore, I am asking for volunteers to help us to take down the paintings and the curtains and move all the furniture into the meeting room area. We will meet on Saturday, 6th September at 10 am in the Hall. I am looking forward to seeing many willing parishioners. In addition, I ask you for your that during the week, vans might be parked outside the church. Please use the swimming pool car park.



NEW EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS AND NEW READERS IN OUR DIVERSE PARISH



In October we would like to recruit new Eucharistic Ministers and new Readers. We are planning to organise a training session for each group. We would like to invite all parishioners, and all our communities to come forward and become involved in the Eucharistic Ministry and in reading during Mass.

In many listening sessions which we had within the Synodal Review, it was often noted how diverse our parish is, and that we need to engage more with all the communities such as the Filipino, Indian, Nigerian, Italian, Polish communities, and so on. This was very successful when we celebrated the *Feast of St Cecilia* and then when these communities led the *Stations of the Cross* with great devotion during Lent. This shows we can do it! All these communities are part of our parish, and they are always welcome to be involved.

7 REASONS FOR BECOMING AN ALTAR SERVER



You have most likely seen them at Mass, up by the altar, helping Fr Gregory or Fr Elvis to keep the Mass running smoothly. Their age ranges from after they have made their First Holy Communion upwards, and they normally wear robes which look very similar to that of the priests, but have you ever considered doing the same?

Here are seven reasons why becoming an altar server might be one of the best things you could choose to do.

- **1.** You can learn a lot about the Mass by serving at the altar. For instance, why is incense used at times? By becoming an altar server, you begin to learn these things and it makes all the symbols of the Mass so much more understandable and interesting.
- 2. You can get more out of Mass through serving at the altar. When you start to understand why we do something, you get so much more from it. More than this though, by serving at the altar you pay more attention to the whole Mass to help you remember where your part fits in. By focusing and understanding what is going on, the Mass can then lead you into a much deeper relationship with God and you feel the impact of Mass far greater!
- **3.** Altar serving can lead to making lots of new friends! By becoming an altar server, you will be meeting up with many of the same people every time you serve at Mass. With a great range of ages and experiences, you will meet some fantastic people you would probably meet nowhere else. As your friendship develops, you will end up having many friends who all share your faith and this can lead to some brilliant conversations and great memories.
- **4.** Altar serving can teach you lots of valuable skills communication, teamwork, perceiving what needs to be done and doing it, punctuality, self-confidence, and more. Serving on the altar is a great place to start building these skills. You are supported by all your fellow servers, you have quite a large responsibly and rules to guide you. Even if you do something wrong, nobody in the congregation usually notices!

5. You can get to know your community better through altar serving. By taking up a responsibility at Mass you start to recognise more and more people in the church in general.

This slowly changes your experience of the church community, from a group of random people you stand next to during Mass, to a large and diverse family who you can meet and chat with every time you go and make you feel truly at home in your church.

- **6.** Whether marriage, consecrated singlehood, religious life or priesthood, altar serving can help you understand your vocation. Every vocation (whether marriage, consecrated singlehood, religious life or priesthood) is awesome and leads us to a greater and deeper understanding and relationship with God. Altar Serving is a great way to begin to see that beauty more fully in both priesthood and religious life.
- **7.** You can gain a greater appreciation of the priesthood by altar serving. Even if you are not discerning priesthood, by altar serving you learn so much more about the priest you work with. This is great because it allows you to both fully appreciate his human side while also appreciating much more the sacramental grace he has been given in holy orders!

PLANNING YOUR WEDDING



If you are planning to get married abroad or at St Edward's Church, you must give us at least six months' notice. This is to ensure that all the preparation that couples are required to do, and the pre-marriage courses are completed along with the necessary paperwork. Please contact the parish office to get the relevant link to the course. You are always welcome to approach me after any Mass, so that you can begin making wedding plans. Please remember that to be legally married in this country, both parties have to be over 18 years old. Depending on circumstances if you have been married before, you may still have the opportunity to be married in the Catholic Church, but this will depend on your personal situation. At least one party must be Catholic. Although you can be married wherever you wish, all the paperwork has to be done by your parish priest in the place where you live.


A DAY PILGRIMAGE TO TYBURN CONVENT AND CRYPT

A NEW ROSARY GROUP IN OUR PARISH

An interesting proposal for those who like and want to pray but... live a busy life. Even though our lives are very busy, together we can pray **200 Hail Marys** every day!



Do you know that the Rosary is an incredibly powerful prayer? Do you have an important intention you'd like to pray for? It could be for your children, parents, for the sick, or for the deceased members of your family. It could be for the Pope, the Bishop, priests, for new vocations, for the sanctity of life. Or perhaps for our parish community, or for world peace? There may be many intentions for which you can pray.

Would you like to be part of a prayer group, but on the other hand you are hesitant and have many doubts, because you realise how busy you are with your family, study, work and so on? Do you know that as a parish, we can pray the entire Rosary every day? Do you know that it is possible, even though the Rosary consists of four mysteries, and each mystery consists of five decades. Yes, as a parish we can pray every day all 4 Mysteries, that is 20 Decades of the Holy Rosary (200 Hail Marys every day!)

Do you know that we can do this without leaving home, coming to church every day, or meeting with fellow parishioners every day or even every week? Would you like to help me start this prayer initiative in our parish? Would you be willing to commit to praying only one Decade of the Rosary every day. You can do this wherever you want, and wherever is convenient for you. It can be done at school or at work. It can be done on your way to work, shopping, or even on holiday. It can be done in the morning, at midday, in the afternoon, evening or at night.

CSSA Thematic Inspection: Survivor Engagement and Support

The Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency (CSSA) has launched a public survey as part of its thematic inspection on survivor engagement and support. The survey invites victims and survivors of abuse, whether recent or historic, to share their experiences of contact with dioceses and Religious Life Groups.

Here in Northampton, we continue to walk alongside survivors through initiatives such as the Healing Garden at Northampton Cathedral and Bishop David's A Time to Listen. We encourage as many survivors as possible to take part in the survey, helping to shape an ever-safer Church for all.

Jubilee Year Indulgence



A plenary indulgence is a grace granted by the Church which cleanses our soul and helps us to grow closer to God. When we sin, we not only damage our relationship with God, we create a need for healing and repair in our souls and in the world. Through Reconciliation God forgives our sins, but the effects of our sins may still need to be addressed. Indulgences are a beautiful practice combining prayer, good works and spiritual renewal, to help repair that damage. Indulgences can also be applied to souls in purgatory.

WHAT IF I CAN'T DO THOSE THINGS DUE TO SICKNESS OR OTHER SERIOUS REASON?

United in spirit with the faithful taking part in person, one may recite the Our Father, Apostles Creed and Jubilee Prayer, offering their sufferings or hardships of their lives.

What must I do?

Be detached from all sin

Make a Sacramental Confession Receive Holy Communion Pray for the Pope's Intentions

Notes: Normally, only one plenary indulgence can be obtained per day, However, the faithful who have carried out an act of charity on behalf of the souls in purgatory, if they receive holy Communion a second time that day, can obtain the plenary indulgence twice on the same day (applicable only to the deceased.)

A single sacramental confession is sufficient for several plenary indulgences, but frequent sacramental confession is encouraged in order to obtain the grace of deeper conversion and purity of heart. For each plenary indulgence that is sought, however, a separate holy Communion and a separate prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father are required.



Our Jubilee Churches



The following churches have been designated Jubilee Churches by Bishop David Oakley within the Diocese of Northampton. A central focus of the Jubilee Year is the forgiveness of sins, especially through the granting of indulgences. As pilgrims of hope we are encouraged to make a pilgirmage to one of these churches, or another designated church outside our diocese, to obtain the graces of an indulgence. Pastoral areas, parishes and individuals are welcome to journey to any of these jubilee sites.
