These are three possibilities that have emerged as realistic options

Option A
1 Priest
1 Church

What does the future look like for St Edward's parish?

Option B
1 Priest
1 Church
3 community led satellites

Option C
1 Priest
2 Churches

one Catholic family - one living Church

Where is the Holy Spirit leading St Edward's Parish next?



OPTION A

1 priest, 1 church
Focus on St Edward's to build community and mission

Church: St Edward's
One centre to focus the Catholic life of the area to create new connections and build community.
Focus on really welcoming those coming from the satellite churches (not to be treated "like refugees").

OPTION B

1 priest, 1 church + 3 community-led satellite hubs
Maintaining the 3 satellite churches as mission hubs while not having Sunday Mass there (not possible with one priest). This would entail repairing the buildings to the tune of £54,415 without assurance that there would be a long term plan for them. The community would be responsible for the ongoing life and maintenance of the hubs.

OPTION C

1 priest, 2 churches.
Focus on St Edward's with mission outpost in Desborough

Churches: St Edward's, Holy Trinity community potentially in larger rented building

Focus on building the faith life of the parish at St Edward's.
A weekly Mass at 12.30pm to be said in Desborough (furthest away from Kettering) as a mission outreach to wider area.

Please have a think about the options - pray about them and talk them over with friends and family.

Remember, we're looking for the option that may best meet the needs and mission of the Catholic community in Kettering and surrounding villages for the next decade. This may not be the one you personally prefer but all comments will help refine the final plan.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF WORD



During term-time on the third and fourth Sundays, a feature of the 10:30 am Mass at St. Edward's is Children's Liturgy. We follow a simple format so the children know the routine of Children's Liturgy. Children listen and pray together, learning the prayers and actions we say during Mass. Children listen to the Gospel reading for Sunday. Through talk and craft activities they explore the message of the Gospel.


COFFEE MORNINGS

MONTHLY / WEEKLY DONATIONS. If there are any New or Existing Parishioners who would like to give to the Parish on a regular basis, then we would be delighted to hear from you. There is a Giving Enquiry Form available for you to complete which is situated on the Notice Board at the Entrance of St Edward's Church. The completed Enquiry Form can be folded and put in the Offertory Collection Bag when attending Mass or placed in an envelope, addressed "Giving Enquiry" and posted through the Presbytery Letter Box at 2, The Grove, Kettering. Alternatively, we can email a copy of this enquiry form on request. Upon receipt of the form, we will contact you to arrange completion of any further necessary paperwork.

Suggested Methods of Regular Giving:

Regular Standing Order via your Bank - this is the preferred way which saves paper and therefore is kinder to the environment. We receive advices of Parishioners payments from the Diocese and we are then able to make sure your donation reaches our Parish.

Giving through Weekly Dated Envelopes which are issued in boxes for use throughout the year.

Donations by Card is a new way of giving, and you will find the Dona Station next to the statue of the Sacred Heart.

Gift Aid, please may we encourage you to consider Gift Aiding your regular donations, providing that you are a UK Tax payer, this means that your giving is increased for the benefit of the Parish. You may indicate your interest on the giving enquiry form.

You can also support the Parish by **making a donation through the letterbox** of the Presbytery.

Please be assured that all information provided is treated in a strict and confidential matter at all times.

We are appealing to our Parishioners who so generously give to our Parish through loose cash Collections taken at Mass. We are asking these Parishioners who may pay Income Tax to consider Gift Aiding their loose cash donations. This would greatly increase church funds which would benefit our Parish. If you can give this some thought and would like more details, then please let the church office know either by email or by letter providing your contact details. All enquiries will be dealt with in a strict and confidential manner. This is a suggestion made by the Diocesan appointed Auditors on their recent visit to the Parish.



A NEW ROSARY GROUP IN OUR PARISH



At present we pray

~ 220 ~

Hail Marys every day!

Do you know that the Rosary is an incredibly powerful prayer? Do you have an important intention you'd like to pray for? It could be for your children, parents, for the sick, or for the deceased members of your family. It could be for the Pope, the Bishop, priests, for new vocations, for the sanctity of life. Or perhaps for our parish community, or for world peace? There may be many intentions for which you can pray.

Would you like to be part of a prayer group, but on the other hand you are hesitant and have many doubts, because you realise how busy you are with your family, study, work and so on? Do you know that as a parish, we can pray the entire Rosary every day? Do you know that it is possible, even though the Rosary consists of four mysteries, and each mystery consists of five decades. Yes, as a parish we can pray every day all 4 Mysteries, that is 20 Decades of the Holy Rosary (**200 Hail Marys every day!**)

Do you know that we can do this without leaving home, coming to church every day, or meeting with fellow parishioners every day or even every week? Would you like to help me start this prayer initiative in our parish? Would you be willing to commit to praying only one Decade of the Rosary every day. You can do this wherever you want, and wherever is convenient for you. It can be done at school or at work. It can be done on your way to work, shopping, or even on holiday. It can be done in the morning, at midday, in the afternoon, evening or at night.

What can I find on the card? On one side of the card is the title of the Mystery of the Rosary, a relevant image, and a short reflection. On the back you can find the following:

+ 1 Our Father + 10 times Hail Mary, Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.
