You can always request confession before or after any weekday Mass.

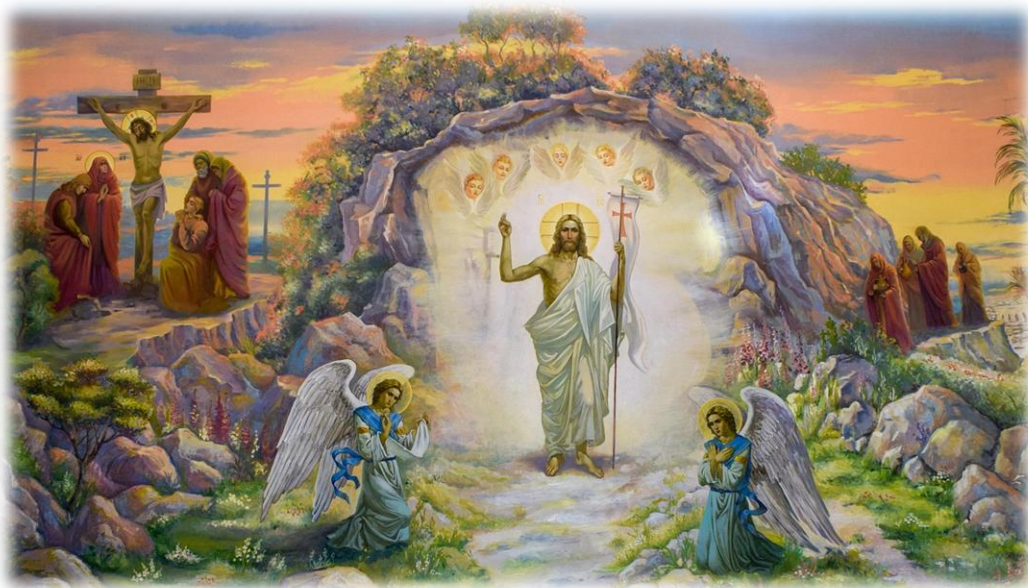

ONE PRIEST OR TWO IN OUR PARISH?



Fr Elvis' arrival in Kettering nearly three years ago

From time to time parishioners ask me: *Father Gregory, how many priests do we actually have in our parish - one or two?* To be honest, neither of these answers would be precise.

When Fr Elvis came to our parish three years ago, he was asked by his Bishop Joseph to undertake pastoral responsibilities and look after the Syro-Malabar community in Kettering, and also the Syro-Malabar community in Bedford. This means that among many other pastoral commitments, Fr Elvis celebrates two Masses in the Syro-Malabar Rite every Sunday: at 2.30 pm in **Kettering**, and at 5 pm in **Bedford**.

In addition, Fr Elvis helps me on weekends by celebrating one of the our 'English Masses' in the Latin Rite, as well as with confessions on Saturdays, and by celebrating weekday Masses occasionally. He visits the sick, he is a chaplain to the Hospital, and the chaplain of St Thomas More School. He is very much appreciated, and I am very grateful for his faithful ministry and hard work, even though his help and support are limited due to his own responsibilities. He is not an assistant priest at St Edward's, but rather a Parish Priest to his Syro-Malabar Communities.

Some of you might not be aware that at St Edward's church there is a Vigil Mass on Saturdays at 6.30 pm, and four Masses every Sunday:

8.30 am - 'English Mass' in the Latin Rite

10.30 am - 'English Mass' in the Latin Rite

1 pm - Polish Mass. This Mass is celebrated by Fr Richard from Corby

2.30 pm - 'Indian Mass' in the Syro-Malabar Rite

The Syro-Malabar Mass is followed by catechism classes until 5 pm.

I cannot expect Fr Elvis to support me in the same way as assistant priests used to support parish priests at St Edward's in the past. Please keep us both in your prayers.

A NEW PRIEST IN OUR DIOCESE AND OUR DEANERY

PLANNING YOUR WEDDING

If you are planning to get married abroad, in another parish or here at St Edward's Church, you must give us at least six months' notice. This is to ensure that all the preparation that couples are required to do, and the pre-marriage courses are completed along with the necessary paperwork. Please contact the parish office to get the relevant link to the course. You are always welcome to approach me after any Mass, so that you can begin making wedding plans. Please remember that to be legally married in this country, both parties have to be over 18 years old. Depending on circumstances if you have been married before, you may still have the opportunity to be married in the Catholic Church, but this will depend on your personal situation. At least one party must be Catholic. Although you can be married wherever you wish, all the paperwork has to be done by your parish priest in the place where you live.

A MESSAGE FROM KIRSTY - ARE YOU AN ORGANIST?



My name is Kirsty, and I am one of the organists in the parish. This is a world away from the previous 30 years I spent playing in funk and disco event bands – often while wearing zebra-print outfits!

I would like to offer a brief insight into **lay music ministry**. This role gives me the privilege of spending many hours immersed in beautiful music while serving the parish. I gain deep fulfilment from planning music for the Masses I serve, carefully aligning hymns and songs with the liturgical season, the readings of the day, and the specific rituals of the Mass, alongside weekly preparation and practice.

Sacred music in the Catholic Church exists to glorify God, sanctify the faithful, and enhance the solemnity of the liturgy. It is not merely a backdrop to worship but an integral part of it, designed to elevate the soul, foster unity, and encourage active participation in the mysteries of faith.

Psalm music, particularly the Responsorial Psalm, holds a central place in the Liturgy of the Word. As a sung meditation and response to the first reading, it invites the congregation into prayerful reflection.

A key focus is always **active participation**. This is sometimes why a well-known tune may be used in place of another hymn tune, helping the congregation to sing with confidence. On occasion, a less familiar hymn may be introduced where it is liturgically appropriate.

Developing as a Catholic church musician has been a steep but rewarding learning curve. It requires balancing technical musical skills and creativity, including improvisation, with theological understanding, always remembering that this is a ministry, not a performance. I am motivated and eager to continue learning and improving.

The Second Vatican Council (1962–1965) reshaped Catholic church music by encouraging active participation by the laity, the use of vernacular languages alongside Latin, and musical forms that speak to the culture of the worshippers. At the

same time, it affirmed that Gregorian chant should retain pride of place and recognised the pipe organ as the Church's traditional instrument.

Being part of our parish's music ministry is a great privilege and blessing in my life. If you are an organist and are considering joining the rota, please speak with Fr Gregory. You will not regret stepping into this ministry.

I am deeply grateful for the encouragement and support of parishioners, which continues to give me the confidence to grow in this role. Although the relocation of the organ has meant losing the radiator behind me, it has also given me access to a microphone port, and the opportunity to sing the psalms on occasion. Singing the psalms brings a profound sense of joy and warmth in a different way. I look forward to continuing to serve at St Edward's Parish.

- Passion for music, positive attitude and a willingness to learn
- Being a 'team player'

Punctuality & Commitment

- Available to sing 3rd Sunday in the month at the 10.30am mass (and on other occasions throughout the year e.g. Christmas and Easter)
- Regular attendance at two Tuesday rehearsals a month (both Tuesdays prior to 3rd Sunday 10.30am mass)
- Be present at the start time of 1900 - End time 2015 (Additional rehearsals negotiated as and when needed)
- Willing to practice your part outside of focused rehearsal times using recorded material and resources provided

Benefits of joining

- **Deepen Your Faith:** Singing sacred music can serve as a form of prayer - as the saying goes, 'those who sing pray twice'.
- **Active Service:** Membership is a direct way to serve your parish community
- **Stress Relief:** Singing releases endorphins and oxytocin, which naturally lower stress levels (cortisol) and boost your mood.
- **Respiratory & Heart Health:** Regular practice improves lung capacity, breath control, and posture.
- **Cognitive Workout:** keeps the brain sharp, improving concentration, memory, and cognitive resilience as you age.
- **Community Connection:** Joining a choir is a powerful way to meet new people and forge lifelong friendships outside of digital interactions.
- And of course, to laugh together, have fun!

A cared for choir is a stable choir, and a stable choir strengthens worship and glorifies God more effectively. Thank you for your kindness, support and encouragement towards the choir. Please speak with Fr Gregory if you want to come along and serve through singing.

Dear Fr Gregory


I am firstly introducing myself as the new strategic lead of Caritas Northampton. I have a connection with St Edward's having grown up in your parish. I wanted to provide an update on your parish's kind donation of £1939.18 in 2023 to Caritas Northampton for the Ukraine appeal. Your parishioner's generous donations were added to by more parishioners, schools and supporters, totalling almost £8,000. Caritas Northampton purchased a fully equipped ambulance, battery packs, clothes and supplies for Ukraine. With the support of Tove Benefice, who have previously supplied 7 previous ambulances to Ukraine, two volunteers drove the ambulance from Towcester on Easter Sunday, carrying 950kg of medical equipment including defibrillators and humanitarian aid. It was handed over to Ukraine-Mother (a Kyiv-based organisation) and frontline military paramedics on Wednesday 8th April 2026.

The items were put to use immediately, helping paramedics save lives and supporting medical stabilisation facilities which treat the injured before they are transferred to hospitals away from the frontline. On behalf of all the team at Caritas Northampton we thank everyone who has donated to this cause and prayed for Ukraine as we stand in solidarity with our brothers and sisters there. Finally, and importantly, Bishop David is keen for Caritas to help parishes be more involved in social action, and it would be great to grow a team of Caritas volunteers within your parish; this might be hands-on volunteering and outreach work, for example food banks or visiting those who are isolated. Or it may be a group that focuses on national campaigns and advocacy, such as migration and the Assisted Dying bill. If your parishioners have new ideas for social action, or are already involved in a project which Caritas could grow, they are very welcome to email and I am always happy to visit you and meet your parishioners.

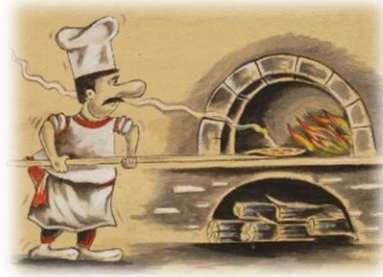

MONTHLY / WEEKLY DONATIONS. If there are any New or Existing Parishioners who would like to give to the Parish on a regular basis, then we would be delighted to hear from you. There is a Giving Enquiry Form available for you to complete which is situated on the Notice Board at the Entrance of St Edward's Church. The completed Enquiry Form can be folded and put in the Offertory Collection Bag when attending Mass or placed in an envelope, addressed "Giving Enquiry" and posted through the Presbytery Letter Box at 2, The Grove, Kettering. Alternatively, we can email a copy of this enquiry form on request. Upon receipt of the form, we will contact you to arrange completion of any further necessary paperwork.

Suggested Methods of Regular Giving:

Regular Standing Order via your Bank - this is the preferred way which saves paper and therefore is kinder to the environment. We receive advices of Parishioners payments from the Diocese and we are then able to make sure your donation reaches our Parish.

Giving through Weekly Dated Envelopes which are issued in boxes for use throughout the year.

Donations by Card is a new way of giving, and you will find the Dona Station next to the statue of the Sacred Heart.

Gift Aid, please may we encourage you to consider Gift Aiding your regular donations, providing that you are a UK Tax payer, this means that your giving is increased for the benefit of the Parish. You may indicate your interest on the giving enquiry form.

You can also support the Parish by **making a donation through the letterbox** of the Presbytery.

Please be assured that all information provided is treated in a strict and confidential matter at all times.

We are appealing to our Parishioners who so generously give to our Parish through loose cash Collections taken at Mass. We are asking these Parishioners who may pay Income Tax to consider Gift Aiding their loose cash donations. This would greatly increase church funds which would benefit our Parish. If you can give this some thought and would like more details, then please let the church office know either by email or by letter providing your contact details. All enquiries will be dealt with in a strict and confidential manner. This is a suggestion made by the Diocesan appointed Auditors on their recent visit to the Parish.

PLANNING YOUR WEDDING



If you are planning to get married abroad, in another parish or here at St Edward's Church, you must give us at least six months' notice. This is to ensure that all the preparation that couples are required to do, and the pre-marriage courses are completed along with the necessary paperwork. Please contact the parish office to get the relevant link to the course. You are always welcome to approach me after any Mass, so that you can begin making wedding plans. Please remember that to be legally married in this country, both parties have to be over 18 years old. Depending on circumstances if you have been married before, you may still have the opportunity to be married in the Catholic Church, but this will depend on your personal situation. At least one party must be Catholic. Although you can be married wherever you wish, all the paperwork has to be done by your parish priest in the place where you live.

BEREAVEMENT MASSES



We all know that bereavement might be a painful and emotional time for those who lost their loved ones. Perhaps you yourself are experiencing this or somebody you know is. Please consider joining us. Pain and sadness caused by death is not as difficult if you can share it with others who are in a similar situation.

Hail Marys every day!

Do you know that the Rosary is an incredibly powerful prayer? Do you have an important intention you'd like to pray for? It could be for your children, parents, for the sick, or for the deceased members of your family. It could be for the Pope, the Bishop, priests, for new vocations, for the sanctity of life. Or perhaps for our parish community, or for world peace? There may be many intentions for which you can pray.

Would you like to be part of a prayer group, but on the other hand you are hesitant and have many doubts, because you realise how busy you are with your family, study, work and so on? Do you know that as a parish, we can pray the entire Rosary every day? Do you know that it is possible, even though the Rosary consists of four mysteries, and each mystery consists of five decades. +++ Sign of the Cross +++

+ 1 Our Father + 10 times Hail Mary, *Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.*

MEMORARE

Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thy intercession, was left unaided. Inspired by this confidence, I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my Mother. To thee do I come, before thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy hear and answer me. Amen.
