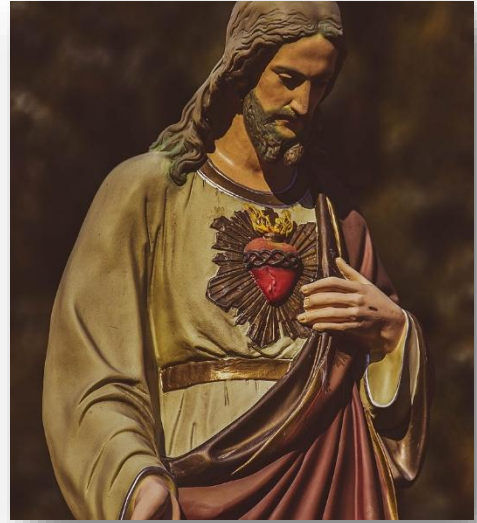

JUNE - THE MONTH OF THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS

June is known as the month of the **Most Sacred Heart of Jesus**. This year, the solemnity falls on **Friday 12th June**. In our parish we will be praying the *Litany to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus* after every weekday Mass just as we prayed the Litany of Loreto in May.

The feast of the MSHJ dates back to 1673, when Jesus appeared to *Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque* and revealed ways to venerate his Sacred Heart and explained the immense love he has for humanity, appearing with his heart visible



outside his chest, on fire, and surrounded by a crown of thorns. These different ways include partaking in a holy hour on Thursdays and the reception of the Eucharist on the first Friday of every month.

Jesus told Sister Margaret Mary: *'My Sacred Heart is so intense in its love for men, and for you in particular, that not being able to contain within it the flames of its ardent charity, they must be transmitted through all means.'*

The promises the Sacred Heart of Jesus made to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque:

1 - I will give them all the graces necessary for their state of life.

2 - I will give peace in their families.

3 - I will console them in all their troubles.

4 - I will be their refuge in life and especially in death.

5 - I will abundantly bless all their undertakings.

6 - Sinners shall find in my heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.

7 - Tepid souls shall become fervent.

8 - Fervent souls shall rise speedily to great perfection.

9 - I will bless those places wherein the image of my Sacred Heart

shall be exposed and venerated.

10 - I will give to priests the power to touch the most hardened hearts.

11 - Persons who propagate this devotion

shall have their names eternally written in my heart.

12 - In the excess of the mercy of my heart, I promise you that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who will receive Communion on the first Fridays, for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance: they will not die in my displeasure, nor without receiving the sacraments; and my heart will be their secure refuge in that last hour.

OUR SECOND 40 HOURS DEVOTION AT ST EDWARD'S

Last year, on the Friday and Saturday before Corpus Christi Sunday, our parish held a 40 Hours Devotion as a part of the Jubilee Year Celebrations. Unfortunately, I had to miss it completely because I had to travel to Poland for the funeral of my father. I was told on my return, that the Adoration had been very prayerful and that many parishioners had taken this opportunity to be with the Lord.



This year we would like to hold our second **40 Hours Devotion** on **Wednesday 24th June from 8 am until 11 pm,**
Thursday 25th June from 8 am until 11 pm
and **Friday 26th June from 9 am until 11 pm.**

Each of us can, of course pray for our own intentions but I will be praying for unity within our Parish and for the transition process, which we are going through.

We have a little time to prepare our parish for this event. **I will have a paper copy of the schedule in the sacristy, so if you would like to add your individual name, your family or the name of any group that you are a part of, please come to the Sacristy.** Any ideas for your particular time slot would be welcome. For instance, you could lead: the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, the Stations of the Cross, you can play and sing Eucharistic hymns, read and meditate on the Scriptures. You should also make time for silent prayer. The most important thing is to adore God present among us in the mystery of the Eucharist, and that is why the Blessed Sacrament is never left alone during those forty hours.

What is the 40 Hours Devotion? The Forty Hours devotion is a special form of solemn exposition of the Most Holy Sacrament for about forty hours, during which continuous prayer is offered in adoration before the Eucharistic Jesus.

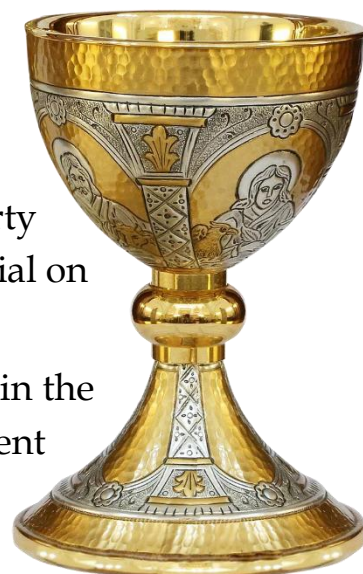
Why forty hours? According to St Augustine of Hippo, forty hours was the time Jesus spent in the Holy Sepulchre from burial on Good Friday to his resurrection on Easter day.

Symbolism of the number 40 in the Bible: The number 40 in the Bible represents a period of purification and atonement (reparation), of tribulation and spiritual trial, of penance and fasting, with the purpose of leading the faithful to repentance of one's sins and so to a renewed conversion to God:

- <> *the Great Flood lasted forty days and forty nights (Genesis 7:12)*
- <> *Moses spent forty days on Mount Sinai waiting to receive the Law (Exodus 24:18);*
- <> *the journey in the desert of the prophet Elijah (1 Kings 19:8)*
- <> *the period of penance in the city of Nineveh lasted forty days (Jonah 3);*
- <> *the journey in the desert of the Jews lasted forty years;*
- <> *the period of fasting of Our Lord Jesus, after the Baptism, lasted forty days and nights (Matthew 4:2);*
- <> *the appearance of Christ to his disciples occurred for forty days after the resurrection (Acts 1:3).*

A bit of history: There is uncertainty on how the devotion originated, possibly around the XII century in Dalmatia. However, the Forty Hours' devotion as it is known today began in Italy during the XVI century as a penitential period in preparation for the Paschal Triduum. In those times when there was great turmoil, instability and war in Europe, priests started exposing the Blessed Sacrament during the forty hours, beseeching the Lord especially for peace in the world. It was also used to draw people away from profane customs and, in fact, it spread as reparation to atone for the sins committed during "Carnevale" (carnival), but also as a remedy for the Reformation. Some of the people who started, developed and promoted the devotion were diocesan priests, others belonged to orders like the Barnabites, the Capuchins and the Jesuits. The Forty Hours' devotion is the origin of Perpetual Adoration.

Saints associated with the development of the Forty Hours: Saint Anthony Zaccaria, Saint Charles Borromeo, Saint Philip Neri, Saint Ignatius Loyola, Saint Alphonsus Liguori.

FEAST DAY OF ST CHRISTOPHER BLESSING OF VEHICLES ON 25th JULY



St. Christopher is considered a 'Christ-bearer'. According to legend, Christopher was a strong and tall man who sought to serve the greatest king he could find. His journey eventually led him to serve Jesus Christ. Apparently, St. Christopher helped travellers traverse a dangerous river. One day, a small child asked Christopher to carry him across. As they crossed the river, this child became increasingly heavy, and Christopher struggled to reach the other side. When they finally arrived, the child revealed

Himself as Christ, carrying the weight of the world's sins. This miraculous encounter transformed Christopher into a faithful Christian, dedicating his life to serving God.

We are blessed to have a very unique **wooden carving of St Christopher**, which was donated by 'Pop' Dolan and American veterans who had been stationed at Grafton Underwood during World War II. Last year, **Kathleen Lev** (*the lady on the photo above*) - the granddaughter of **Colonel Dolan** - came from America to visit our parish. She was very proud of her grandfather, and was deeply touched when she saw this carving of St Christopher.

Since **St Christopher** is patron saint of drivers, I would like to organise a **blessing of vehicles** at the **swimming pool car park** after each Mass on **25th July**. This would involve me coming across to the exit of the car park and blessing any departing car or motorbike with holy water. By my side I will have one of our altar servers who will hold a basket for donations. We would like to raise funds towards a very large **television screen** for the parish hall where our Sunday Masses are streamed. We hope this will encourage parishioners to use the Hall more often when the church seems crowded.



A NEW PRIEST IN OUR DIOCESE

The church remains open on each **Wednesday** after Mass until **12 noon**. Please take this opportunity to spend some time with the Lord.

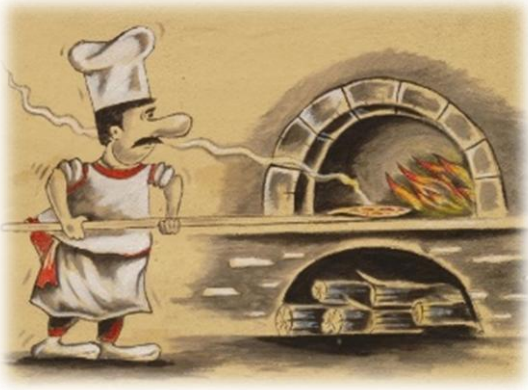


COFFEE MORNINGS

PLANNING YOUR WEDDING

If you are planning to get married abroad, in another parish or here at St Edward's Church, you must give us at least six months' notice. This is to ensure that all the preparation that couples are required to do, and the pre-marriage courses are completed along with the necessary paperwork. Please contact the parish office to get the relevant link to the course. You are always welcome to approach me after any Mass, so that you can begin making wedding plans. Please remember that to be legally married in this country, both parties have to be over 18 years old. Depending on circumstances if you have been married before, you may still have the opportunity to be married in the Catholic Church, but this will depend on your personal situation. At least one party must be Catholic. Although you can be married wherever you wish, all the paperwork has to be done by your parish priest in the place where you live.

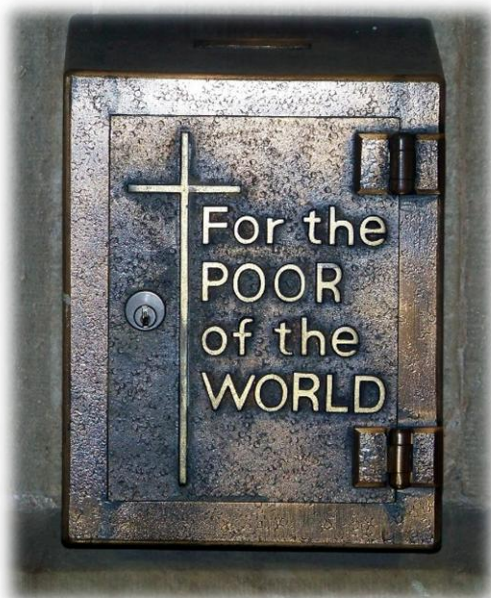

WEEKLY/MONTHLY DONATIONS AND LOOSE COLLECTIONS

MONTHLY / WEEKLY DONATIONS. If there are any New or Existing Parishioners who would like to give to the Parish on a regular basis, then we would be delighted to hear from you. There is a Giving Enquiry Form available for you to complete which is situated on the Notice Board at the Entrance of St Edward's Church. The completed Enquiry Form can be folded and put in the Offertory Collection Bag when attending Mass or placed in an envelope, addressed "Giving Enquiry" and posted through the Presbytery Letter Box at 2, The Grove, Kettering. Alternatively, we can email a copy of this enquiry form on request. Upon receipt of the form, we will contact you to arrange completion of any further necessary paperwork.



Suggested Methods of Regular Giving:

Regular Standing Order via your Bank - this is the preferred way which saves paper and therefore is kinder to the environment. We receive advices of Parishioners payments from the Diocese and we are then able to make sure your donation reaches our Parish.

Giving through Weekly Dated Envelopes which are issued in boxes for use throughout the year.

Donations by Card is a new way of giving, and you will find the Dona Station next to the statue of the Sacred Heart.

Gift Aid, please may we encourage you to consider Gift Aiding your regular donations, providing that you are a UK Tax payer, this means that your giving is increased for the benefit of the Parish. You may indicate your interest on the giving enquiry form.

You can also support the Parish by **making a donation through the letterbox** of the Presbytery.

Please be assured that all information provided is treated in a strict and confidential matter at all times.

We are appealing to our Parishioners who so generously give to our Parish through loose cash Collections taken at Mass. We are asking these Parishioners who may pay Income Tax to consider Gift Aiding their loose cash donations. This would greatly increase church funds which would benefit our Parish. If you can give this some thought and would like more details, then please let the church office know either by email or by letter providing your contact details. All enquiries will be dealt with in a strict and confidential manner. This is a suggestion made by the Diocesan appointed Auditors on their recent visit to the Parish.

OUR PARISH ROSARY GROUP

Hail Marys every day!

Do you know that the Rosary is an incredibly powerful prayer? Do you have an important intention you'd like to pray for? It could be for your children, parents, for the sick, or for the deceased members of your family. It could be for the Pope, the Bishop, priests, for new vocations, for the sanctity of life. Or perhaps for our parish community, or for world peace? There may be many intentions for which you can pray.

Would you like to be part of a prayer group, but on the other hand you are hesitant and have many doubts, because you realise how busy you are with your family, study, work and so on? Do you know that as a parish, we can pray the entire Rosary every day? Do you know that it is possible, even though the Rosary consists of four mysteries, and each mystery consists of five decades. Yes, as a parish we can pray every day all 4 Mysteries, that is 20 Decades of the Holy Rosary (*200 Hail Marys every day!*)

Do you know that we can do this without leaving home, coming to church every day, or meeting with fellow parishioners every day or even every week? Would you like to help me start this prayer initiative in our parish? Would you be willing to commit to praying only one Decade of the Rosary every day. You can do this wherever you want, and wherever is convenient for you. It can be done at school or at work. It can be done on your way to work, shopping, or even on holiday. It can be done in the morning, at midday, in the afternoon, evening or at night.

+ **Saturday at 6:30 pm** - the **Joyful Mysteries**. On the first Saturday of each month after the 6.30 pm Mass they will meet in Our Lady's chapel to say one decade of the Rosary together and exchange their cards.

+ + or **Sunday at 8:30 am** - the **Sorrowful Mysteries**. On the first Sunday of each month after the 8.30 am Mass we will meet in Our Lady's chapel to say one decade of the Rosary together and exchange our cards.

+ + + or **Sunday at 10:30 am** - the **Glorious Mysteries**. On the first Sunday of each month after the 10.30 pm Mass we will meet in Our Lady's chapel to say one decade of the Rosary together and exchange our cards.

+ + + + or **Wednesday at 10 am** - the **Mysteries of Light**. On the first Wednesday of each month after the 10 am Mass they will meet in Our Lady's chapel to say one decade of the Rosary together and exchange their cards.



What can I find on the card? On one side of the card is the title of the Mystery of the Rosary, a relevant image, and a short reflection. On the back you can find the following:

I undertake to recite the following prayers every day:

+ + + **Sign of the Cross** + + +

+ 1 Our Father + 10 times Hail Mary,
Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and

*to the Holy Spirit: As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end.
Amen.*
